### Descriptions & Features of CSA Databases

\*Descriptions are abbreviated from CSA

#### ATLA Religion Database

\*The ATLA Religion Database is the premier index to journal articles, book reviews, and collections of essays in all scholarly fields of religion. Featuring articles written in 36 languages, ATLA includes over 400,000 article citations from over 1,400 journals, 600 of which are currently indexed. It also provides bibliographic coverage of over 200,000 essay citations from 15,500 multi-author works, over 375,000 book reviews, and features 128,000 subject-headings.

Journals are selected for inclusion according to their scholarly merit and scope. Journals representing all the major religious faiths, major denominations, and numerous language groups are included.

#### When might you search this database?

When you need to find articles or books about: theology; religions of the world; exegesis of scripture passages; church; philosophical questions with ethical or religious dimensions; Christianity, etc.

- Does not have a Thesaurus, but the subject headings/descriptors assigned to each item are hot linked to find more materials on that topic
- Use Indexes to search for materials on particular scripture passages. Click the Search Tools tab and choose Scripture Citation Index (or find a link to indexes at the bottom of the Advanced Search page)



- Books and articles indexed in ATLAS which do NOT appear to be available from the Bethel University Library **are often available from Bethel Seminary Library**. Be sure to search CLICnet for book and periodical titles (not article titles) before assuming there is no immediate access

#### ERIC (Educational Resources Information Center)

\*Sponsored by the U.S. Department of Education to provide extensive access to educational-related literature ERIC provides access to some 14,000 **documents** and over 20,000 **journal articles** per year.

- ED = ERIC documents. Ex: ED 408275
  - The most recent years of these documents are available online via full text links

- Microfiche of documents from ED308235 (about 1990) onward is available in the BUL
- Older documents can be order from forms on the Library homepage
- EJ = Journal articles
  - Search for BUL Full Text to determine availability

***When might you search this database?***

Whenever your research involves subjects related to any aspect of education—not just k-12 or college. e.g., professional development; health education; drivers ed; environmental education; community ed; extension services, etc.

**Physical Education Index**

\*Records are indexed and classified from peer-reviewed journals, report literature, conference proceedings, trade magazines, patents, articles from the popular press, and many other publications. Beginning in January 2001, enhancements to the database include the addition of abstracts, e-mail addresses, expanded publisher and author information, and other data to facilitate access to the fulltext.

Coverage includes physical education curricula, sports medicine, dance, sport law, kinesiology, motor learning, recreation, standardized fitness tests, sports equipment, business and marketing, coaching and training, and sport sociology/psychology, health education and physical therapy.

***When might you search this database?***

Pretty well summed up in the coverage info above ;-}.

**\*PsycARTICLES**

A database of full-text articles from 51 journals published by the American Psychological Association, the APA Educational Publishing Foundation, the Canadian Psychological Association, and Hogrefe & Huber. The database includes all material from the print journals with the exception of advertisements and editorial board lists.

- Search by Author, Keyword Journal Title
- Browse through a particular journal by viewing Table of Contents (TOC)
- Full text is usually available in PDF or HTML
- **ALL of the articles are indexed in PsycINFO**
  - **Generally, it's best to search in PsycINFO so you don't miss all the articles and other materials on your topic that may not be available in PsycARTICLES!**

**\*PsycINFO**

Access to international literature in psychology, related disciplines such as psychiatry, education, business, medicine, nursing, pharmacology, law, linguistics, and social work.

Sources include over 1,800 professional journals, chapters, books, reports, theses and dissertations, published internationally. Additionally, there are more than 8 million cited references in 185,000 journal articles, books, and book chapters.

***When might you search this database?***

When your topic involves a psychological dimension, e.g.: emotional/behavioral problems; depression; organizational behavior; psychiatric disorders; cognitive development; leadership qualities & behavior, etc.

### \*Social Services Abstracts

Provides bibliographic coverage of current research focused on social work, human services, and related areas, including social welfare, social policy, and community development. The database abstracts and indexes over 1,406 serials publications and includes abstracts of journal articles and dissertations, and citations to book reviews.

#### ***When might you search this database?***

When you're doing research on any aspect of the social services spectrum. From the National Association of Social Workers: "Social work research addresses psychosocial problems, preventive interventions, treatment of acute and chronic conditions, and community, organizational, policy and administrative issues. Covering the lifespan, social work research may address clinical, services and policy issues."

### \*Sociological Abstracts

Abstracts of journal articles and citations to book reviews drawn from over 1,809 serials publications, and also provides abstracts of books, book chapters, dissertations, and conference papers from the international literature in sociology and related disciplines in the social and behavioral sciences.

#### ***When might you search this database?***

From the American Sociological Association: "Sociology is the study of social life, social change, and the social causes and consequences of human behavior. Sociologists investigate the structure of groups, organizations, and societies, and how people interact within these contexts. Since all human behavior is social, the subject matter of sociology ranges from the intimate family to the hostile mob; from organized crime to religious cults; from the divisions of race, gender and social class to the shared beliefs of a common culture; and from the sociology of work to the sociology of sports." < <http://www.asanet.org/public/what.html>>

## Search Options

### To Do a Keyword Search

All CSA databases are set to start in the Advanced Search mode.

Under the Search Tools tab, choose Journal Name Index


Type title of the journal




## To Combine Searches:


