



SELECTED EDUCATION RESOURCES

1. Databases

ERIC

Indexes articles (EJ#) and documents (ED#) on all topics related to education. Most documents from 1996 to the present are available online.

PsycINFO

Covers journal articles, books and chapters, dissertations, technical reports. Includes abstracts of materials in psychology, medicine, psychiatry, education, social work, sociology, and organizational behavior.



Professional Collection

A custom selection of more than 300 full text journals for educators in multiple subjects, ranging from arts to learning disabilities to athletic training.



Teacher Reference Center

Provides indexing and abstracts for over 280 of the most popular teacher and administrator trade journals to assist professional educators.

MasterFILE Premier

A multidisciplinary database providing full text for 2,053 periodicals covering general reference, business, health, education, general science, multicultural issues, etc. Contains full text for more than 350 reference books, 84,074 biographies, and 86,132 primary source documents and an Image Collection of more than 107,000 photos, maps, and flags.



Academic Search Premier

Indexes articles in magazines, journals, and newspapers, as well as some books and primary source documents, spanning virtually every area of academic study. Provides full text for more than 4,600 scholarly publications, including more than 3,500 peer-reviewed journals.

InfoTrac Junior Edition

Designed for students in junior high and middle school. Covers magazines, newspapers, and reference books for information on current events, the arts, science, popular culture, health, people, government, history, sports, and more.



InfoTrac Student Edition

Designed for high school students. Provides access to a variety of indexed and full text magazines, newspapers, and reference books for information on current events, the arts, science, popular culture, health, people, government, history, sports, and more.



Kids InfoBits

Meets the research needs of students in Kindergarten through Grade 5. It features developmentally appropriate, visually graphic interface, a subject-based topic tree search and full text, age-appropriate, curriculum-related magazine, newspaper and reference content for information on current events, the arts, science, health, people, government, history, sports and more.



CQ Researcher

Explores "hot" issues in the news in depth. Topics range from social and teen issues to environment, health, education, and science and technology. Its hallmark is scrupulous objectivity and balance. Numerous charts, graphs and sidebar articles round out each report.



Opposing Viewpoints Resource Center

Covers social issues. Includes full text periodicals, newspapers, journals, pamphlets, primary source documents, statistics, images, websites, and students research tools.

Published by Oxford University Press. A fully-indexed, cross-searchable database of about 100 dictionary, language reference, and subject reference works.



Gale Virtual Reference Library

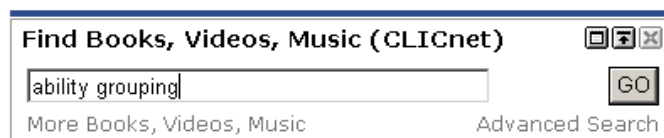
Provides access to a number of online, subject specific encyclopedias such as: "Encyclopedia of Educational Leadership and Administration".

- Indexes books, videos, DVDs, and audios held at the libraries in the CLIC consortium (Members: Augsburg College, Bethel University, Bethel Seminary, College of St. Catherine, Concordia University, Hamline University, Macalester College, Northwestern College, University of St. Thomas)
- Includes eBooks (electronic books), available from NetLibrary, that can be read online anytime, anywhere

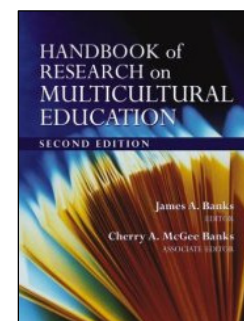
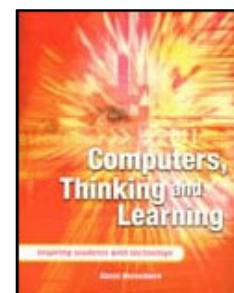

5. Research & Writing Aids


Research Wizard

Identifies resources with which to begin your research. Specify a subject for your research question, along with your time frame and the types of materials you need. The Wizard will bring back all kinds of good sources, from databases to quick reference to websites chosen by librarians as useful and credible for your subject.
